Jarden Consumer Solutions Donates \$167,000 to Charities in First Quarter, 2007

BOCA RATON, Fla. — May 3, 2007 — Jarden Consumer Solutions (JCS) announced today that its employee-funded JCS Community Fund donated \$167,000 for the first quarter of 2007 as part of its ongoing efforts to give back to the communities in which the Company's employees live and work.

“Our employees make possible the JCS Community Fund’s ability to invest in the improvement of our community,” said Rocki Rockingham, JCS vice president, community relations and communications. “This quarter’s grants reflect both a diversity of agencies and populations being assisted. Our employees’ generosity has become an example of excellence in the community, and we are proud to share the news of their charitable activities.”

The organizations and amounts for which the JCS Community Fund approved grants during the first quarter of 2007 are as follows:

- **Boca Helping Hands**, a Boca Raton-based agency that provides food and assistance programs to the homeless and other at-risk individuals and families, received a \$5,000 grant to support its hot meals program.
- **Children, Hope & Horses**, a Boca Raton-based agency that provides an interactive child-and-horse (equine therapy) program for abused, neglected and abandoned children, received a \$15,000 grant for operational support to its programs that builds self-esteem, self-worth and confidence in the youth served.
- **Daily Bread Food Bank**, a Miami-based organization that helps feed hungry families in South Florida, received a \$20,000 grant to continue Jarden Consumer Solutions’ sponsorship of the agency’s “Extra Helpings” Program in which perishable food donations from restaurants and caterers are received and distributed to various area feeding programs.

- **The Delray Beach Public Library** received a \$12,000 grant to fully fund the literacy component of the City's summer camps for approximately 360 elementary and 120 middle school children. During camp, the children will participate in weekly programs designed to help them maintain reading skills while out of school during the summer.
- **Expanding & Preserving Our Cultural Heritage (EPOCH)**, which collects and preserves Palm Beach County's African-American history and operates the Spady Cultural Heritage Museum in Delray Beach, received a \$10,000 grant to enhance its Kids Cultural Club, in which at-risk children learn various social and research skills. EPOCH will now be able to expand the program with traveling displays and lectures in Palm Beach County schools.
- **Kids In Distress (KID)**, an agency dedicated to the care and treatment of abused children and the prevention of child abuse, received \$10,000 grants (\$20,000 total) for two different programs — its Broward County-based Therapeutic Preschools that serve children with emotional problems and its Supported Foster Care Program in Palm Beach County, which aims for placement permanency through providing 24/7 support to foster families and children.
- **Milagro Center**, which provides arts education and academic skills to disadvantaged children in the Delray Beach area, received a \$30,000 grant again this year to support its programs for approximately 40 at-risk children in Delray Beach.
- **Oasis Compassion Center**, a Greenacres-based organization that helps to prevent homelessness, received a \$5,000 grant to provide funding for a teacher and materials to help its Hispanic clients to improve their English skills, thereby expanding their opportunities to secure job placement.
- **Twin Palm Center for the Disabled**, a Boca Raton-based agency that provides day programs to mentally disabled adults in order to teach life skills leading to independence, received a \$15,000 grant for continued operations.
- **YMCA of South Palm Beach County** received a \$15,000 grant to supply need-based scholarships for children participating in the Exceptional Child Program Teen Summer Camp, which serves teen-aged children with disabilities in South Palm Beach County.
- **YMCA of Broward County** received a \$15,000 to provide more than 100 need-based scholarships to at-risk children so that they could afford summer camp, as well as funding to teach healthy cooking classes to children to help combat childhood obesity.

The Jarden Consumer Solutions Community Fund is the Company's employee-funded charitable giving entity. As a 501(c)(3) organization, the Community Fund provides monetary grants to qualified charitable organizations that engage in community development initiatives (focusing on at-risk women, families and youth, and food programs) that serve the communities where JCS employees live and work.
