### **Jarden Consumer Solutions Donates \$105,000 to Charities in October**

BOCA RATON, Fla. — October 27, 2008 — Jarden Consumer Solutions (JCS) announced today that its employee-funded JCS Community Fund approved more than \$105,000 in grants this month as part of its ongoing efforts to give back to the communities where its employees live and work.

“The employees of Jarden Consumer Solutions realize that it is in times of economic uncertainty that those who have the least are affected the most,” stated Rocki Rockingham, JCS vice president, community relations and communications. “Whether it is hot meals for the hungry, educational opportunities for at-risk children, or access to health care for low-income families, JCS employees are making possible a number of important programs that help improve our communities.”

The South Florida organizations and amounts for which the JCS Community Fund approved grants during the third quarter of 2008 are as follows:

- **211 Palm Beach/Treasure Coast** received a \$5,000 grant to fully fund student clubs at three Boca Raton-area high schools, with a goal of promoting 211’s services among at-risk teens in the community.
- **Achievement Centers for Children & Families**, a Delray Beach-based agency that provides quality, affordable child care and educational services to at-risk youth and families, received a \$15,000 grant to fund the purchase of food for the agency’s hot meal program for at-risk youth.
- **American Red Cross, Greater Palm Beach Area Chapter**, received \$6,950 to fully fund the agency’s babysitting “boot camp,” which teaches youth proper care techniques. Additionally, the grant will support CPR/First Aid classes for at-risk youth being served by and staff working at various non-profit agencies in the community.

- **Barton’s Boosters**, a Boca Raton agency that provides after-school programs for at-risk youth, received a \$15,000 grant to provide for a certified Exceptional Student Education (ESE) teacher to work with ESE students for homework assistance and in keeping up with classroom standards in language arts and mathematics.
- **Boca Helping Hands**, a Boca Raton-based agency that provides food and assistance programs to the homeless and other at-risk individuals and families, received a \$5,000 grant to support its hot meals program.
- **Delray Youth Basketball Boosters** received a \$6,000 grant to support recreational activities for at-risk youth before and after school in Delray Beach.
- **Habitat for Humanity of Broward** received a \$5,000 grant to fully fund the printing of homeowner education materials for the agency’s “Family Support” program.
- **March of Dimes** received a \$7,500 grant to fund an educational awareness campaign to promote prenatal care and help prevent premature births by at-risk and low-income women.
- **Palm Beach County Community Health Alliance**, a West Palm Beach-based agency dedicated to improving health care access, received a \$5,000 grant to support the agency’s “navigator” program, which helps low-income individuals find appropriate health resources and services.

In addition to the grants issued in Florida, the JCS Community also provided donations to charitable organizations in Missouri (\$29,775) and Tennessee (\$5,000).

The Jarden Consumer Solutions Community Fund is the Company’s employee-funded charitable giving entity.
