**Jarden Consumer Solutions Donates \$125,000 to Charities in Fourth Quarter 2006**  
***Employee-Funded Program Donates Approximately \$400,000 in 2006***

BOCA RATON, Fla. — January 8, 2007 — Jarden Consumer Solutions (JCS) announced today that its employee-funded Community Fund donated nearly \$400,000 in 2006 — \$125,000 in the fourth quarter alone — as part of its ongoing efforts to give back to the communities in which its employees live and work.

“Every year, our employees raise the bar on their commitment to make a difference,” stated Rocki Rockingham, Jarden Consumer Solutions vice president, community relations and communications. “In total for 2006, the Community Fund distributed approximately \$400,000 to qualified charitable organizations. This dedication and generosity ultimately enables us to strengthen the communities in which the Company operates and our employees reside.”

The organizations receiving JCS Community Fund grants during the fourth quarter of 2006, as well as the grant amounts, are as follows:

- **American Lung Association of Florida** received a \$7,000 grant to fully fund the “Open Airways for Schools” program, in which underprivileged children in Palm Beach County learn to manage their asthma.
- **Bethesda Hospital Foundation** received a \$13,000 grant to purchase a high-tech electronic fetal monitor to help improve prenatal care services.
- **Boys & Girls Clubs of Miami** received a \$5,000 grant to purchase software that helps at-risk children from poorly rated schools prepare for the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT).
- **Child & Family Connections**, a foster care agency in Palm Beach County, received a \$5,000 grant supporting its “Stabilizing Families Support Fund,” which provides families with one-time, temporary financial assistance.

- **Cooperative Feeding Program**, a Fort Lauderdale-based organization that each year provides more than one million meals to the hungry in Broward County, received a \$30,000 grant to purchase food (approximately 60,000 meals).
- **Dan Marino Foundation**, an organization focused on educating and helping individuals affected by autism, received a \$5,000 grant that will allow the agency to create four additional six-week play sessions for at-risk children with autism.
- **Gateway Community Outreach**, a Deerfield Beach-based organization that works to prevent hunger and homelessness, received a \$10,000 grant for general support of its programs.
- **Gilda's Club of South Florida**, a Fort Lauderdale-based agency that provides social and emotional support to anyone touched by cancer in the community, received a \$15,000 grant that will allow it to expand its "Ask the Doctor" monthly dinner series program to both Boca Raton and Miami-Dade area residents.
- **Gulfstream Goodwill Industries** received \$5,000 to purchase equipment and continue the construction of its life skills classroom that the agency uses to help rehabilitate individuals with traumatic brain injuries.
- **Regis House**, a Miami-based agency that provides after-school programs for at-risk youth in grades one through three, received a \$30,000 grant that will allow the agency to expand its services to children in Little Havana.

The Jarden Consumer Solutions Community Fund is the Company's employee-funded charitable giving entity. As a 501(c)(3) organization, the Community Fund provides monetary grants to qualified charitable organizations that engage in community development initiatives (focusing on at-risk women, families and youth, low-income families and food programs) that serve the communities where JCS employees live and work.
